CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

Pursuant to Article 233(2) of the Constitution, paragraph 3 of the First Schedule of the Public Service Commission Act (Act No. 10 of 2017), as read together with section 3 and 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, (No. 33 of 2011), His Excellency the President nominated Amb. Anthony Mwaniki Muchiri for appointment to the position of Chairperson Public Service Commission.

The nomination was conveyed to the Speaker of the National Assembly through a letter dated 15th November, 2021. On Thursday 25th November 2021 the Speaker of the National Assembly conveyed the Message from H.E. the President to the House and referred the Nominee's name and Curriculum Vitae to the Departmental Committee on Administration and National Security for Vetting and reporting to the House in accordance with the provisions of Standing Order 45.

In compliance with section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Friday, 26th November 2021. The Clerk invited the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee in conformity with Section 6(9) of the Act. Submission of Memoranda was to be received by Friday, 3rd December 2021 at 5.00 pm. By close of the deadline, the Committee had not received any submission in support or contesting the suitability of the Nominee to hold the office to which he had been nominated.

Further, in fulfilment of the provisions of Article 118(1)(b) of the Constitution, Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act and Standing Order 45(3), the Clerk of the National Assembly on Friday, 26th November 2021 placed an advertisement in the print media notifying the public on the date, time and place of the approval hearing of the Nominee.

Further, on Friday, 26th November 2021 the Clerk wrote to the Nominee inviting him to the approval hearing which was scheduled to be conducted on Tuesday, 7th December 2021, in the Main-Chamber, Parliament Buildings at 10.00 am.

Section 6(7) of the Act provides that an approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background. To fulfill the requirement on personal integrity, the Clerk on Friday, 26th November 2021 wrote to the Kenya Revenue Authority, the Ethics

and Anti-Corruption Commission, the Registrar of Political Parties, the Higher Education Loans Board and the Directorate of Criminal Investigation to ascertain the Nominees' good standing with the said government institutions. The Nominee was also required to submit clearance from the said institutions.

The Committee is grateful to the Offices of the Speaker and the Clerk of the National Assembly for the logistical and technical support accorded to it during the consideration of the Report. Finally, I wish to express appreciation to the Honourable Members of the Committee and all those who made useful contributions towards the preparation and production of this report.

CHAPTER ONE PREFACE

ESTABLISHMENT AND MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

1.1 Mandate of the Committee

- The Departmental Committee on Administration and National Security is established in accordance with the provisions of Standing Order 216 of the National Assembly. Its mandate as provided for in S.O. 216(5) is –
 - (a) investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned Ministries and departments;
 - (b) study the programme and policy objectives of Ministries and departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
 - (c) study and review all legislation referred to it;
 - (d) study, assess and analyze the relative success of the Ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
 - (e) investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned Ministries and departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the House;
 - (f) to vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 204 (Committee on Appointments);
 - (g) examine treaties, agreements and conventions;
 - (h) make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation;
 - (i) consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House, pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and

- (j) examine any questions raised by Members on matters within its mandate.
- The subjects under the Committee's jurisdiction are; national security, police services, home affairs, public administration, public service, prisons, immigration, the management of natural disasters and community service orders.

CHAPTER TWO

INTRODUCTION

2.1 Message from the President

- 5. Pursuant to the provisions of Article 233(2) of the Constitution, Paragraph 3 of the First Schedule of the Public Service Commission Act (No. 10 of 2017), as read together with Section 3 and 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, His Excellency the President nominated Amb. Anthony Mwaniki Muchiri for appointment to the position of Chairperson, Public Service Commission;
- 6. The nomination was conveyed to the Speaker of the National Assembly vide a letter Ref.OP/CAB1/31A dated 15th November, 2021. On Thursday, 25th November, 20201, the Speaker of the National Assembly conveyed the Message from H.E. the President to the House and referred the Nominee's name and curriculum vitae to the Committee for Vetting and reporting to the House.

2.2 Nomination and appointment process

- 7. Article 250(2) (b) of the Constitution read together with Paragraph 3(3) (d) of the First Schedule to the Public Service Commission Act(No. 10 of 2017) provide for the process through which the holder of the position of Chairperson Public Service Commission is recruited. The Constitution provides that the recruitment of officers to Public office should be conducted in a competitive, transparent and fair process before nomination for appointment by H.E the President with the approval of the National Assembly.
- 8. The National Assembly, having received the name of the nominee was obligated to conduct approval hearings and make a determination of the nominee's suitability or otherwise within fourteen(14) days as provided for in section 8(1) of the Public Appointment(Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011).

2.3 Report of the Selection Panel for nomination of Chairperson, Public Service Commission

9. In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 10(2) of the Public Service Commission Act (No. 10 of 2017), H.E the President declared a vacancy in the Office of the Chairperson Public Service Commission Vide Gazette Notice No. 8626 of 23rd August 2021.

- Subsequently, and in accordance with the provisions of Paragraph 3(3)(d) of the First Schedule of the Public Service Commission Act (No. 10 of 2017), a seven member panel was constituted vide Gazette Notice No. 10282 of 1st October 2021 for the selection of nominees for appointment.
- The Selection Panel invited suitably qualified persons to apply for the position of Chaiperson Public Service Commission vide Kenya Gazette No. 11088 of 15th October 2021.
- 12. At the lapse of the application period, the Panel had received ninety nine (99) applications out of which twelve (12) were shortlisted and interviewed on 10th and 11th November 2021.
- 13. At the end of the interviews, the three top candidates were:
 - i) Amb. Anthony Mwaniki Muchiri (77.3 %)
 - ii) Ms. Charity Seleina Kisotu (75.9%), and
 - iii)Dr. Kennedy Juma Mulunda(70.8%)

2.4 Committee Proceedings

14. The Committee held a total of two sittings to examine and review the nominee's certificates and testimonials, consider public views and hold a vetting meeting with the nominee.

CHAPTER THREE

3.0BACKGROUND INFORMATON

- 3.1 Legal Framework
- 15. Establishment of the Public Service Commission and nomination for appointment to office

16.Article 250(2) (b) of the Constitution provides that—

- (1) The Chairperson and each member of a Commission and the holder of independent office shall be—
 - (a) identified and recommended for appointment in a manner prescribed by National legislation;
 - (b) approved by the National Assembly; and
 - (c) appointed by the President.
- 17. Article 233 (1) (2) of the Constitution establishes the Public Service Commission which consists of a chairperson, a vice chairperson and seven other members appointed by the President with the approval of the National Assembly.
 - 18. Article 233 (3) of the Constitution of Kenya provides as follows-
 - (3) Subject to clause (4), a person is not eligible for appointment as a member of the Commission if the person—
 - (a) has, at any time within the preceding five years, held office, or stood for election as—
 - (i) a member of Parliament or of a county assembly; or
 - (ii) a member of the governing body of a political party; or
 - (b) holds any State office;
 - (c) is, or has at any time been, a candidate for election as a member of Parliament or of a county assembly; or
 - (d) is, or has at any time been, the holder of an office in any political organisation that sponsors or otherwise supports, or has at any time

sponsored or otherwise supported, a candidate for election as a member of Parliament or of a county assembly.

- 19. The Committee observed that the issues for consideration are provided for under Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 which provides as follows-
 - (i) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;
 - (ii) any Constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question;
 - (iii) the suitability of the nominee for appointment proposed with due regard as to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meets the needs of the body to which the nomination is made
 - 20. Article 250(2) (b) of the Constitution provides that—
 - (2) The Chairperson and each member of a Commission and the holder of independent office shall be—
 - (a) identified and recommended for appointment in a manner prescribed by National legislation;
 - (b) approved by the National Assembly; and
 - (c) appointed by the President.
 - 3.2 Constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question
 - (i) Qualifications for appointment as Chairperson of the Public Service Commission
 - 21. Article 233 (3) of the Constitution of Kenya sets out the eligibility criteria for members of the Public Service Commission as follows-
 - (3) Subject to clause (4), a person is not eligible for appointment as a member of the Commission if the person—
 - (a) has, at any time within the preceding five years, held office, or stood for election as—
 - (i) a member of Parliament or of a county assembly; or
 - (ii) a member of the governing body of a political party; or

- (b) holds any State office;
- (c) is, or has at any time been, a candidate for election as a member of Parliament or of a county assembly; or
- (d) is, or has at any time been, the holder of an office in any political organisation that sponsors or otherwise supports, or has at any time sponsored or otherwise supported, a candidate for election as a member of Parliament or of a county assembly

- 22. The Public Service Commission Act (No. 10 of 2017) also sets out other qualifications for appointment as chairperson and member of Commission. Section 8 provides as follows—
 - (1) Subject to Article 233(3) of the Constitution, a person shall be qualified for appointment as the chairperson or vice-chairperson of the Commission if that person—
 - (a) is a citizen of Kenya;
 - (b) holds a degree from a university recognized in Kenya;
 - (c) has at least ten years' experience in their respective profession;
 - (d) has at least six years' experience in a managerial position either in the public or private sector; and
 - (e) meets the requirements of leadership and integrity in Chapter Six of the Constitution.
 - 23. The schedule to the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act also provides for the criteria to guide the Committee in terms of qualifications which include—
 - (a) Education background and employment record;
 - (b) Public office, political activities and affiliations;
 - (c) Deferred income or future benefits;
 - (d) Sources of income, tax status, statement of net worth;
 - (e) Potential conflict of interest;
 - (f) Pro bono or charity work;
 - (g) Whether the nominee has been charged in a court of law of convicted of a criminal offence; and
 - (h) Adverse mention in an investigatory report of a parliamentary Committee or Commission
 - 24. Having interrogated and examined the nominee's CV, certificates and testimonials, the Committee found that the nominee qualified for appointment to the position.
 - (ii) Leadership and Integrity

- (a) While determining the suitability of the nominee for appointment as Chairperson of Public Service Commission, the Committee took into account the provisions of leadership and integrity as provided for by Chapter 6 of the Constitution of Kenya. Most importantly, the Committee took into account the following provisions-
- (b) Article 73(2) states as follows-
- 25. The guiding principles of leadership and integrity include
 - i) Selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability, or election in a free and fair election;
 - ii) Objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favouritism, other improper motives or corrupt practices;
 - iii) Selfless service based solely on the public interest demonstrated by-
 - iv) honesty in the execution of public duties; and
 - v) the declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties;
 - vi) Accountability to the public for decisions and actions; and
 - vii) Discipline and commitment in service to the people.
 - (c) Article 75(1) provides as follows-
- 26. A state officer shall behave, whether in public and official life, in private life, or in association with other persons in a manner that avoids-
 - Any conflict between personal interests and public official duties;
 - b. Compromising any public or official interest in favour of personal interest; or
 - c. Demeaning the office, the officer holds
 - (d) Article 75 (3) of the Constitution prohibits any person who has been dismissed or otherwise removed from public office from subsequently holding any other public office.
 - (e) Article 77 provides restriction on activities of state officers as follows-
 - (1) A full time State Officer shall not participate in any other gainful employment;
 - (2) Any appointed State Officer shall not hold office in a political party;

- (3) A retired State Officer who is receiving pension from public funds shall not hold more than two concurrent remunerative positions as chairperson, director or employee of
 - (a) A company owned or controlled by the state

(b) A State organ

(4) A State Officer shall not receive remuneration from public funds other than contemplated in clause (3)

(f) Article 78 of the Constitution disqualifies persons who are not Kenya Citizens and persons holding dual citizenship from appointment as state officers.

3.3 Notification to nominee and Chapter six clearance requirements

- 28. On Friday, 26th November, 2021 the Clerk of the National Assembly wrote to the Nominee inviting him to the approval hearing which was scheduled to be conducted on Tuesday, 7th December, 2021, in the Main Chamber, Parliament Buildings at 10.00 am.
- 29. To fulfill the requirement on personal integrity, the Clerk on Friday, 26th November, 2021 wrote to the Kenya Revenue Authority, the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, the Registrar of Political Parties and the Higher Education Loans Board to ascertain the Nominees' good standing with the said government institutions. The Nominee was also required to submit clearance from the said institutions.

3.4 Request for Memoranda and notification to the Public

- 30. Further, in fulfilment of the provisions of Article 118(1) (b) of the Constitution, Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act and Standing Order 45(3), the Clerk of the National Assembly on Friday, 26th November, 2021 placed an advertisement in the print media notifying the public on the date, time and place of the approval hearing of the Nominee.
- 31. In compliance with section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Friday, 26th November, 2021. The Clerk invited the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee in conformity with Section 6(9) of the Act. Submission of Memoranda was to be received by Friday, 3rd December, 2021 at 5.00 pm.

3.5 Submission of Memoranda

32. By close of the deadline, the Committee had not received any submission in support or contesting the suitability of the Nominee to hold the office to which he had been nominated. The Clerk of the National Assembly however received an affidavit by Okiya Omtata Okoiti on 6th December, 2021, which fell outside the period stipulated for submission of memoranda and was therefore inadmissible for consideration by the Committee.

CHAPTER FOUR

4.0 APPROVAL HEARING

- 33. The Committee conducted approval hearing for the nominee on Tuesday 7th December, 2021. In conducting the vetting exercise the Committee was guided by among other documents, the Constitution of Kenya, The Public Appointments(Parliamentary Approval) Act(No. 33 of 2011), the Public Service Commisson Act(No.10 of 2017) and the National Assembly Standing Orders.
- 34. The Committee also considered the following in vetting the nominee:
 - a) Academic Qualification
 - b) Employment record and work experience
 - c) Public office, political activities and affiliations
 - d) Potential conflict of interest
 - e) Suitability for the position
 - f) Tax compliance
 - g) Vision and leadership
 - h) Integrity
 - i) Expectations and key priority areas

4.1 Vetting of Amb. Anthony Mwaniki Muchiri

4.1.1 Personal background

 The nominee Amb. Anthony Mwaniki Muchiri, is a Kenyan citizen by birth, and bearer of National Identity Card Number 5540331. He was born in Nyeri County on 21st April 1961.

4.1.2 Educational background

36. He holds a Bachelor of Commerce from Nagpur University in India which concentrated on accounts, auditing and Income Tax, Economics and Law. He attained a postgraduate Diploma from the University of Nairobi on International Relations and a certificate from University of Oxford on Diplomatic Studies.

4.1.3 Professional background

37. In the course of his career, he attended the following training courses and programmes-

- (a) Administrative officers paramilitary course;
- (b) Advanced public administration at Kenya Institute of Administration;
- (c) Certificate in peace making and preventive diplomacy;
- (d) Africa Egypt diplomatic training programme for diplomatic studies;
- (e) Managing political and economic change; leaders in development; and
- (f) Executive Master's in Business Administration.

4.1.4 Employment records and Work Experience

- 38. Amb. Anthony Mwaniki Muchiri is the current ambassador of Kenya to Cuba and also represents Jamaica, Barbados, St. Kits and Nevis, Guyana, Dominican Republic (CARICOM). He previously was the Head of Mission to the Republic of Kenya in Havana, Cuba.
- 39. He started his career as an Assistant Inspector of State Coorporations in 1984 a position he held for four years and moved to Assistant Secretary in the ministry of National Guidance and Political Affairs till 1990. He joined the Ministry of Foreign affairs in 1997 as Second Secretary and Deputy Head Finance and Administration Division. He has risen through the ranks to ambassador of Kenya to Cuba. His work experience spans over thirty years.

4.1.5 Clearance requirement

40. The Committee confirmed that the nominee was duly cleared by KRA, HELB, ORPP, EACC and DCI and that the Clerk of the National Assembly had received communication to that effect.

4.1.6 Net-Worth

41. The nominee informed that the Committee that his Net-worth is Kshs. 114,000,000(One Hundred and fourteen million), accumulated through salaries and allowances. The nominee added that he has made some investments and inherited property from his parents and grandparents.

4.1.7 Other issues

42. On addressing corruption in the public sector, he informed the Committee that if appointed he would ensure that the civil servants are inculcated with good values and principles through trainings in Kenya School of Government (KSG); he would also use the experience acquired in the

- public service to ensure that the public service is efficient in delivery of services.
- 43. In 2009, he led a team from the Ministry of Lands and that of the National Treasury in assessing whether the country would get value for money in the purchase of land for the construction of the Kenyan mission in Tokyo as opposed to leasing a premise. After the purchase of the property they were charged with abuse of office in procuring the embassy without following due process. The nominee confirmed to the Committee that the court cleared him of all the charges through a ruling made in Anti-Corruption Case No. 2 of 2013 dated 30th March, 2016.
- 44. On addressing the issues of youth unemployment, he said that if appointed he would employ policies, proper organized training and vocational activities through Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET); He would ensure Technical and Vocational Education and Training Centre had well renumerated human resource to impact knowledge and skills to the youth.
- 45. On addressing low morale in the public service, he said that if appointed he would come up with a sustainable programmes to address job stagnation, low wages and to bring back the morale of the civil servants; he would also ensure that performance management system is in place so that the best performing employees are rewarded. This would boost the morale of the civil servants.
- 46.On succession management, he said that if appointed he would come up with strategies to address the existing and future succession management challenges.
- 47. On addressing challenges facing County Public Service Boards, he said that if appointed he would have a meeting with the members of the County Public Service Boards to ensure that what is determined by the Public Service Commission and is implemented. He proposed the amendment of the Public Service Commission Act (No. 10 of 2017) to empower the Commission play its role in arbitration of human resource related disputes arising from Counties.

- 48.On the powers of the Public Service Commission to constitute and abolish offices in the Public Service and its limitation, the nominee noted that the powers are limited in respect of state officers, High Commissioners and Ambassadors, Parliamentary Service, Judicial Service, Teachers Service Commission and county Governments among others.
- 49.On the legal framework that govern the Public Service, the nominee noted that the Constitution of Kenya 2010, the Public Service Commission Act, 2017 and Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003 are the key legal instruments that govern the public service.
- 50.On regional diversity, he said that if appointed he would ensure that those people who are recruited to work in the public service reflect the face of Kenya; and
- 51.On working with the National Employment Authority, he said that if appointed he would employ stakeholder engagement approach and come with the best approach to address the unemployment challenges in the Country

CHAPTER FIVE

5.0 OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS

- 52. The Committee observations were guided by Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act(No. 33 of 2011) in terms of issues for consideration as follows:
 - i. The procedure used to arrive at the nominee
 - ii. Any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question, and

- 53. The Committee having considered the nominee's curriculum Vitae and heard oral submissions during the vetting exercise conducted on 7th December, 2021, made the following observations and findings, THAT the nominee Amb. Anthony Mwaniki Muchiri:
 - i) Is a Kenyan citizen born on 21st April 1961 in Nyeri County;
 - ii) Met the educational requirement of the Office as set out in Section 8 of the Public Service Commission Act (No. 10 of 2017). He is a holder of a Masters Degree in Public Administration and a Bachelors degree in Commerce.
 - iii) Met the minimum experience required having served in the Public Service for a cumulative period of over 37 years in various capacities, from an Assistant Inspector of State Coorporations in 1984 to the current position of Kenyas Ambassador to Cuba and concurrently of Permanent Representative to Jamaica, Barbados, St. Kitts and Nevis, Guyana and Dominican Republic since 2018.

Briefing from the Chairperson

a) Pursuant to the provisions of Article 233(2) of the Constitution, Paragraph 3 of the First Schedule of the Public Service Commission Act (No. 10 of 2017), as read together with Section 3 and 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, His Excellency the President nominated Amb. Anthony Mwaniki Muchiri for appointment to the position of Chairperson, Public Service Commission;

b) The nomination was conveyed to the Speaker of the National Assembly on 15th November, 2021. On Thursday, 25th November, 20201, the Speaker of the National Assembly conveyed the Message from H.E. the President to the House and referred the Nominee's name and curriculum vitae to the

Committee for Vetting and reporting to the House;

c) In compliance with section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Friday, 26th November, 2021. The Clerk invited the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee in conformity with Section 6(9) of the Act. Submission of Memoranda was to be received by Friday, 3rd December, 2021 at 5.00 pm. By close of the deadline, the Committee had not received any submission in support or contesting the suitability of the Nominee to hold the office to which he had been nominated; The Clerk of the

- National Assembly however received an affidavit by Okiya Okoiti on 6th December, 2021, which fell outside the period stipulated for submission of memoranda.
- d) Further, in fulfilment of the provisions of Article 118(1) (b) of the Constitution, Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act and Standing Order 45(3), the Clerk of the National Assembly on Friday, 26th November, 2021 placed an advertisement in the print media notifying the public on the date, time and place of the approval hearing of the Nominee.;
- e) Further, on Friday, 26th November, 2021 the Clerk wrote to the Nominee inviting him to the approval hearing which was scheduled to be conducted on Tuesday, 7th December, 2021, in the Main Chamber, Parliament Buildings at 10.00 am;
- f) Section 6(7) of the Act provides that an approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background. To fulfill the requirement on personal integrity, the Clerk on Friday, 26th November, 2021 wrote to the Kenya Revenue Authority, the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, the Registrar of Political Parties and the Higher Education Loans Board to ascertain the Nominees' good standing with the said government institutions. The Nominee was also required to submit clearance from the said institutions; and
- g) The Nominee was therefore rightly and procedurally before the Committee for the Vetting and subsequent appointment to the position of Chairperson, Public Service Commission in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, the Act and the National Assembly Standing Orders.

Amb. Anthony Mwaniki Muchiri the nominee appeared before the Committee and informed the Committee as follows-

- a) He was born in Jerusalem in Nairobi County;
- b) He went to Jericho Primary School and later to Kagumo Secondary School;
- c) He has Bachelor of Commerce Degree from Nagpur University, India which he acquired in 1984;
- d) He is a career civil servant. He served in different positions i.e. Assistant Inspector, Inspectorate of State Corporations, Cabinet Office, Office of the President, Assistant Secretary, Ministry of National Guidance and Political Affairs, Assistant Secretary, Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, Nairobi, Kenya, Second Secretary and Deputy Head, Finance and Administration Division, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Nairobi, Kenya, Second Secretary and Deputy Head, International Organizations and Conferences Division, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Nairobi, Kenya, First Secretary and Deputy Head of Africa Division, Ministry of Foreign Affairs,

Nairobi, Kenya, Chef de Cabinet - Office of the Permanent Secretary, Secretary to the Cabinet and Head of the Public Service, Office of the President, Nairobi, Kenya among others;

e) His net-worth was Ksh. 114,000,000. Most of his wealth came from investments he made through his salary while serving in the Geneva and

inheritance from his grandmother;

f) He was currently serving as an Ambassador/ Embassy of the Republic of Kenya, Havana (Concurrently High Commissioner/Ambassador/ Permanent Representative of Kenya to Jamaica, Barbados, St. Kitts and Nevis, Guyana,

Dominican Republic, CARICOM);

g) On addressing corruption in the public sector, he said that if appointed he would ensure that the civil servants are inculcated with good values and principles through trainings in Kenya School of Government (KSG); he would also use his experience he has acquired through time to ensure that the public service is efficient in delivery of services;

h) In 2009, he was appointed to lead a team in Japan to identify property to buy and build embassy. He was to lead a team from the Ministry of Land and that of the National Treasury. After the purchase of the property they were charged with abuse of office in procuring the embassy without following due process. In making the ruling, the court acquitted of all charges in relation to the Tokyo Embassy scam;

i) In June 2008, he was not ambassador to Libya when the Grand Regency Scandal concerning the sale of the Grand Regency Hotel from the Central

Bank of Kenya to an unspecified group of Libyan investors;

j) On addressing the issues of youth unemployment, he said that if appointed he would employ policies, proper organized training and vocational activities through Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET); He would ensure Technical and Vocational Education and Training Centre had well numerated human resource to impact knowledge and skills to the youth;

k) On addressing low morale in the public service, he said that if appointed he would come up with a sustainable programmes to address job stagnation, low wages and to bring back the morale of the civil servant; he would also ensure that performance management system is in place so that the best performing employees are rewarded this would boost the morale of the civil servant;

l) On succession management, he said that if appointed he would come up with strategies to address the existing and future succession management

challenges;

m) On addressing challenges facing County Public Service Boards, he said that if appointed he would have a meeting with the members of the County Public Service Boards to ensure that what is determined by the Public Service Commission and is supposed to be implemented is implemented;

n) On the powers of the Public Service Commission to constitute and abolish offices in the Public Service and its limitation, the nominee noted that the powers are limited in respect of state officers, High Commissioners and Ambassadors, Parliamentary Service, Judicial Service, Teachers Service Commission and county Governments among others.

o) On the legal framework that govern the Public Service, the nominee noted that the Constitution of Kenya 2010, the Public Service Commission Act, 2017 and Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003 are the key legal instruments that govern





Oxford University Foreign Service Programme

I am writing to give you a short report on the participation of Anthony Mwaniki Muchiri in the 1999/2000 course, which ended recently, and of his success in the end-of-year examinations.

The Foreign Service Programme provides a course of post-graduate study lasting over a full academic year which is designed to give its students deeper insights into international affairs in theory and practice, and into current specific political and economic problems. It includes separate courses in Diplomatic Studies and Practice, International Politics, International Trade & Finance and International Law. FSP members have access to the full range of the university's intellectual resources, and the opportunity to improve and update their knowledge and intellectual skills, with a view to acquiring fresh impetus in their diplomatic careers. They also have the opportunity to relate to and learn from a group of talented contemporaries, members of other diplomatic services.

Teaching is provided in lectures from both university teachers and distinguished outside speakers, through inter-active seminars, and by means of tutorial discussion in small groups on the basis of prepared work. These facilitate the exchange of ideas over a wide range of issues. Training is also provided in media techniques and in multilateral negotiation. There are opportunities to study French, Spanish and other languages. A key component of the course is a series of study visits to business and media institutions and international organisations in London and other European cities, and a detailed study of the Northern Ireland Peace Process, which includes a three-day visit to Belfast. The year's course is thus a test of intellectual and physical energy and discipline, as well as of character.

Mr. Muchiri played an active part throughout the course. In the final examinations he achieved a Merit in Diplomatic Practice, a Pass in International Politics, a Pass in International Trade & Finance and a Merit in

.. Muchiri worked steadily and made an increasing impact in the group as the year wore on. His written work was always accurate, competent and interesting, and he contributed helpfully to discussion, drawing on his own relevant experience. He also made an impact in University activities, by winning an inter-collegiate middle-distance running competition. This did not hamper his above-average performance n the final examinations. With his outgoing personality and sense of humour he won many friends for Cenya of which he was a most effective representative.

- THAT I swear this affidavit to oppose H. E. the President's nomination of Mr Antony Mwaniki Muchiri, who is from the Kikuyu Community, for Parliament's approval for appointment as the Chairperson of the Public Service Commission.
- 5. THAT the appointment of Mr Antony Mwaniki Muchiri will exacerbate the violation of Article 250(4) of the Constitution, which provides that "Appointments to commissions and independent offices shall take into account the national values referred to in Article 10, and the principle that the composition of the commissions and offices, taken as a whole, shall reflect the regional and ethnic diversity of the people of Kenya." [My emphasis.]
- THAT I am aware that with a combined force of at least 24 members on the
 constitutional commissions and independent offices, members of the Kikuyu
 community are overrepresented and the appointment of Mr Antony Mwaniki
 Muchiri from the same community will make matters worse.

- THAT the appointment of Mr Antony Mwaniki Muchiri will bring the number
 of members of the Kikuyu community to two on the Public Service
 Commission. The other member of the community being, Andrew N. Muriuki.
- 8. <u>THAT</u> in the circumstances, the National Assembly should reject his nomination and ask the President to nominate eligible an candidate from those Kenyan communities which have few or no representation on the commissions and independent offices.
- 9. THAT in view of the above, and pursuant to Parliament's duty to promote and safeguard constitutionalism and the rule of law, I verily believe that it is now incumbent upon this Honourable Committee of the House to reject the nomination of Mr Antony Mwaniki Muchiri, and to leave no doubts in the minds of the public that the law will henceforth be applied with certainty.
- 10. <u>THAT</u> what is deponed to herein is true to the best of my knowledge save what has been deponed to on information and belief the sources and grounds whereof have been respectively specified.

The Public Service Commission is one of the Constitutional Commissions created by the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 vide Article 233 (2).

The Commission comprises of a chairperson, a vice chairperson and seven other members. Article 233(3) read together with Section 8 (2) of the Public Service Commission Act, 2017 provides for the minimum requirements for appointment to the Position of the chairperson, Public service Commission.

The Public Service Commission, Act 2017 and Article 10 of the Constitution provide further guidance on the recruitment process for Chairperson, Vice chairperson and Member of the Commission.

In view of the foregoing, it is proposed that the shortlisting for the positing of Chairperson be undertaken in the according with the milestones set out hereinafter as follows:

SHORTLISTING CRITERIA /TOOL FOR THE POSITION OF CHAIRPERSON - PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION (PSC)

1ST Round

 Exclude any applicant who does not meet any of the requirements set out in the Public Service Commission Act, 2017 and the advert:

The Public Service Commission Act 2017 under section 8(1) states that: - A person shall be qualified for appointment as chairperson of the Public Service Commission if such person-

- (a) Is a citizen of Kenya;
- (b) Holds a degree from a university recognized in Kenya;
- (c) Has at least 10 years' experience in their respective profession;

- (d) Has at least six (6) years' experience in a managerial position either in the public or private sector, and;
- (e) Meets the requirements of leadership and integrity in Chapter Six of the Constitution.
- 2. The Constitution under Article 233 (3) and (4) provides for disqualifications for persons aspiring for the Office of the chairperson, Public Service Commission. Therefore, apply the disqualification criteria for appointment by excluding any applicant who:
 - (a) Has, at any time within the preceding five years, held office, or stood for election as:
 - (i) A member of Parliament or of a county assembly; or
 - (ii) A member of the governing body of a political party; or
 - (b) Holds any state office;
 - (c) Is, or has at any time been, a candidate for election as member of parliament or of a county assembly; or
 - (d) Is or has at any time, the holder of an office in any political organization that sponsors or otherwise supports, or has at any time sponsored or otherwise supported, a candidate for lection as a member of parliament or of a county assembly.

Article 233 (4) states that Clause 3 (c) and (d) cease to apply to a person after two general elections for Parliament have been held since the person ceased to be such a candidate or office holder.
